Description:

In 2017-18, CSGS will fund at least three Free-Standing Course in the. Courses significantly engaged with feminist, queer, trans*, or other refractions of gender and sexuality theory will be especially welcomed. They can be generic -- as in a focused Queer Theory course, for example -- or they might cut a topical swath through an interdisciplinary question. We are especially interested that the course and the teachers represent interdisciplinary training, and we will prioritize that in our evaluation of proposals. But we also understand that some disciplines are so capacious that people training in the same field might bring together diverse kinds of archive and method, and we will consider that too.

Salary: \$5,000/\$6,000 depending on graduate student status

Qualifications:

We invite applications for these free-standing lectureships from all interested Ph.D. students in all divisions and professional schools. Students applying to teach must have had their dissertation proposals accepted by October 1, 2017.
